Restraint: --Choice between the standing and recumbent positions must be decided by the probable complacency of the patient and the skill of the operator. For the standing position the horse is backed into a single stall and confined to the pillars with the dental halter. The head must be brought downward within easy reach. If the operation is resisted by forcible movements of the jaw a mouth speculum may be applied. The mouth speculum should, however, be avoided if possible, as it will interfere with the free use of the instruments. For the recumbent position the patient is placed in a dorso-lateral attitude with the mouth speculum adjusted and the head inclining upward. Anaesthesia is not advisable, owing to the greater danger of blood flowing into the trachea. Modus operandi: --The first requirement is to loosen the tooth. It is safe to assert that the tooth...
